We suggest the following rubric be added to your bulletins: On January 22, 2018, the Presiding Bishop and President of the House of Deputies called the Episcopal Church to make this Ash Wednesday a day of prayer in particular regarding the sin and brokenness of sexual exploitation in the church. This Litany of Penitence has been revised in order to respond to our leaders' call to prayers of healing and repentance.

Ash Wednesday Litany of Penitence, revised for repentance for sexual misconduct in the church

The Celebrant and People together, all kneeling

Most holy and merciful Father:
We confess to you and to one another,
and to the whole communion of saints
in heaven and on earth,
that we have sinned by our own fault
in thought, word, and deed;
by what we have done, and by what we have left undone.

All kneel.

We have not loved you with our whole heart, and mind, and

strength. We have not loved our neighbors as ourselves. We have

not forgiven others, as we have been forgiven.

People Have mercy on us, Lord.

Celebrant We have been deaf to your call to serve, as Christ served us. We

have not been true to the mind of Christ. We have grieved your

Holy Spirit.

People Have mercy on us, Lord.

Celebrant We confess to you, Lord, all our past unfaithfulness: the pride,

hypocrisy, and impatience of our lives,

People We confess to you, Lord.

Celebrant Our self-indulgent appetites and ways, and our exploitation of other

people,

People We confess to you, Lord.

Celebrant Our anger at our own frustration, and our envy of those more

fortunate than ourselves,

People We confess to you, Lord.

Celebrant Our intemperate love of worldly goods and comforts, and our

dishonesty in daily life and work,

People We confess to you, Lord.

Celebrant Our negligence in prayer and worship, and our failure to commend

the faith that is in us,

People We confess to you, Lord.

Celebrant Accept our repentance, Lord, for the wrongs we have done: for our

blindness to human need and suffering, and our indifference to

injustice and cruelty,

People Accept our repentance, Lord.

Celebrant For all false judgments, for uncharitable thoughts toward our

neighbors, and for our prejudice and contempt toward those who

differ from us,

People Accept our repentance, Lord.

Celebrant For our waste and pollution of your creation, and our lack of

concern for those who come after us,

People Accept our repentance, Lord.

Celebrant Holy Trinity, One God, accept our thanks and praise for all the

blessings of this life, especially for those blessings that our present

circumstances make difficult to see,

People Hear us, O Lord of Life.

Celebrant Shed the light of your healing love on all affected by sexual

misconduct in your church, that they may find new wholeness

illumined by your grace,

People Hear us, O Lord of Life.

Celebrant Knit together in your love all whose relationships have frayed, that

they may find reconciliation and new beginnings,

People Hear us, O Lord of Life.

Celebrant Help us to see and accept our own responsibility in the harm that

has been done and for which we repent and seek forgiveness. Give

us the wisdom to be a healthier and safer church. May we see that

we all participate in this holy, hard and good work,

People Hear us, O Lord of Life.

Celebrant Hold in the palm of your hand all who are most affected by sexual

misconduct in your church both in these days and through the generations. May our repentance move us to a renewed life as a

community of the beloved,

People Hear us, O Lord of Life.

Celebrant Grant all who turn to you the courage to participate with you in

restoring this broken world to wholeness, that everyone and

everything may share in the hope of your kingdom,

People Hear us, O Lord of Life.

Celebrant Restore us, good Lord, and let your anger depart from us;

People Favorably hear us, for your mercy is great.

Celebrant Accomplish in us the work of your salvation,
People That we may show forth your glory in the world.

Celebrant By the cross and passion of your Son our Lord,

People Bring us with all your saints to the joy of his resurrection.

The Celebrant stands and says

Almighty God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who desires not the death of sinners, but rather that they may turn from their wickedness and live, has given power and commandment to his ministers to declare and pronounce to his people, being penitent, the absolution and remission of their sins. He pardons and absolves all those who truly repent, and with sincere hearts believe his holy Gospel.

Therefore we beseech him to grant us true repentance and his Holy Spirit, that those things may please him which we do on this day, and that the rest of our life hereafter may be pure and holy, so that at the last we may come to his eternal joy; through Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen*.
